Bipolar Illness: Personal Experiences. Professional Implication

Kay Redfield Jamison, PhD Kay Redfield Jamison, PhD is Professor of Psychiatry at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and Honorary Professor of English at the University of St. Andrews in Scotland. She is a co-author of the standard text on manic-depressive illness, and

author of "Touched with Fire," "An Unquiet Mind" and "Night Falls Fast." Her memoir about her experiences with manicdepressive illness, "An Unquiet Mind", was selected by the Boston Globe, Entertainment Weekly and the Seattle Post Intelligencer as one of the best books of 1995, and was on the New York Times Best Seller list for more than five months. Her most recent book, "Night Falls Fast: Understanding Suicide," was a national best seller, translated into fifteen languages, and selected by the New York Times as a Notable Book of 1999. Dr. Jamison, formerly the director of the UCLA Affective Disorders Clinic, was selected as a UCLA Woman of Science. She is the recipient of many awards for her research in affective disorders. She has been awarded numerous honorary degrees. She was Distinguished Lecturer at Harvard University in 2002 and a Litchfield Lecturer at the University of Oxford in 2003. She was selected as a MacArthur Fellow in 2001.

The Physician and Intelligence Analysis

Leslie R. Pyenson, M.D. joined the Central Intelligence Agency in 1973 and served for varying periods in increasingly responsible assignments within its operations, science and technology, mission support and intelligence directorates, retiring in July, 2003. In 1992, Dr. Pyenson was appointed Chief of the C.I.A. Intelligence Directorates VIP Medical Analysis Center.. This is the only United States Government unit in which medical professionals maintain records, analyze data and report to U.S. senior civilian and military policymakers on the health and personality of foreign persons — and increasingly on public health issues — especially problems that may affect governance, decision-making processes, negotiating tactics and likelihood of remaining in office. Dr. Pyenson has received awards and citations from the C.I.A., F.B.I. and N.S.A. He was named Intelligence Fellow in 1992 and awarded the Distinguished Intelligence Medal in 2003, C.I.A.'s highest, for meritorious service. He has written or supervised the writings of innumerable classified analyses and co-authored the only three unclassified medical analyses by the United States approved for external publication: "Patterns of Death in World Leaders," "The Impact of Coronary Heart Disease on World Leaders," and "The Impact of Stroke on World Leaders."

Eyewitness Identification From Line-ups

Gary L. Wells, PhD

Gary L. Wells, Ph.D. is Professor of Psychology at Iowa State University and holds the title of Distinguished Professor. He is an internationally recognized scholar in scientific psychology and his studies of eyewitness memory are widely known and cited. Dr. Wells has authored approximately 150 articles and chapters and two books. Most of this work has been focused on the reliability of eyewitness identification. His research on eyewitness identification continues to be funded by the National Science Foundation, and his findings have been incorporated into standard textbooks in psychology and law. His studies demonstrate how the rate of mistakes in eyewitness identification can be exacerbated by the methods that crime investigators use in conducting line-ups and photo spreads. His research proposals on line-up procedures, such as the use of double-blind techniques, are being increasingly accepted in law enforcement practices across the United States. He has served as an expert for the defense, prosecution, and plaintiffs in criminal and civil cases in the United States and Canada. His conclusions about eyewitness identification have received national media attention. In 2001, Dr. Wells was awarded the Distinguished Contributions to Psychology and Law Award for the American Psychology-Law Society.

COURSES

Understanding Risk Assessment

Michael A. Norko, MD

This course will present a framework for understanding the role of psychiatry in risk assessment. The presentation will explore the strengths and limitations of various approaches to determining risk through a critical review of seminal research on the correlates of violence and the accuracy of risk assessments. An analysis of the appropriate use of actuarial versus clinical assessment will be presented, as well as a review of recent critiques regarding risk assessment. Finally, an approach to the task of risk assessment that accommodates a synthesis of available research will be presented, as well as an alternative model based on assessment of functional capacity.

The Psychiatrist As Expert Witness

Phillip J. Resnick, MD

This course will present information on preparation of legal reports, pre-trial conferences, depositions, and courtroom rules of confidentiality and privilege. Participants will learn to cope with cross-examiners who attack credentials, witness bias, adequacy of examination, and the validity of expert's reasoning. Examples of powerful and powerless testimony, as well as mistakes commonly made by witnesses will be demonstrated. Videotape segments from actual trials and mock trials will illustrate different styles of testimony and cross-examination techniques.
