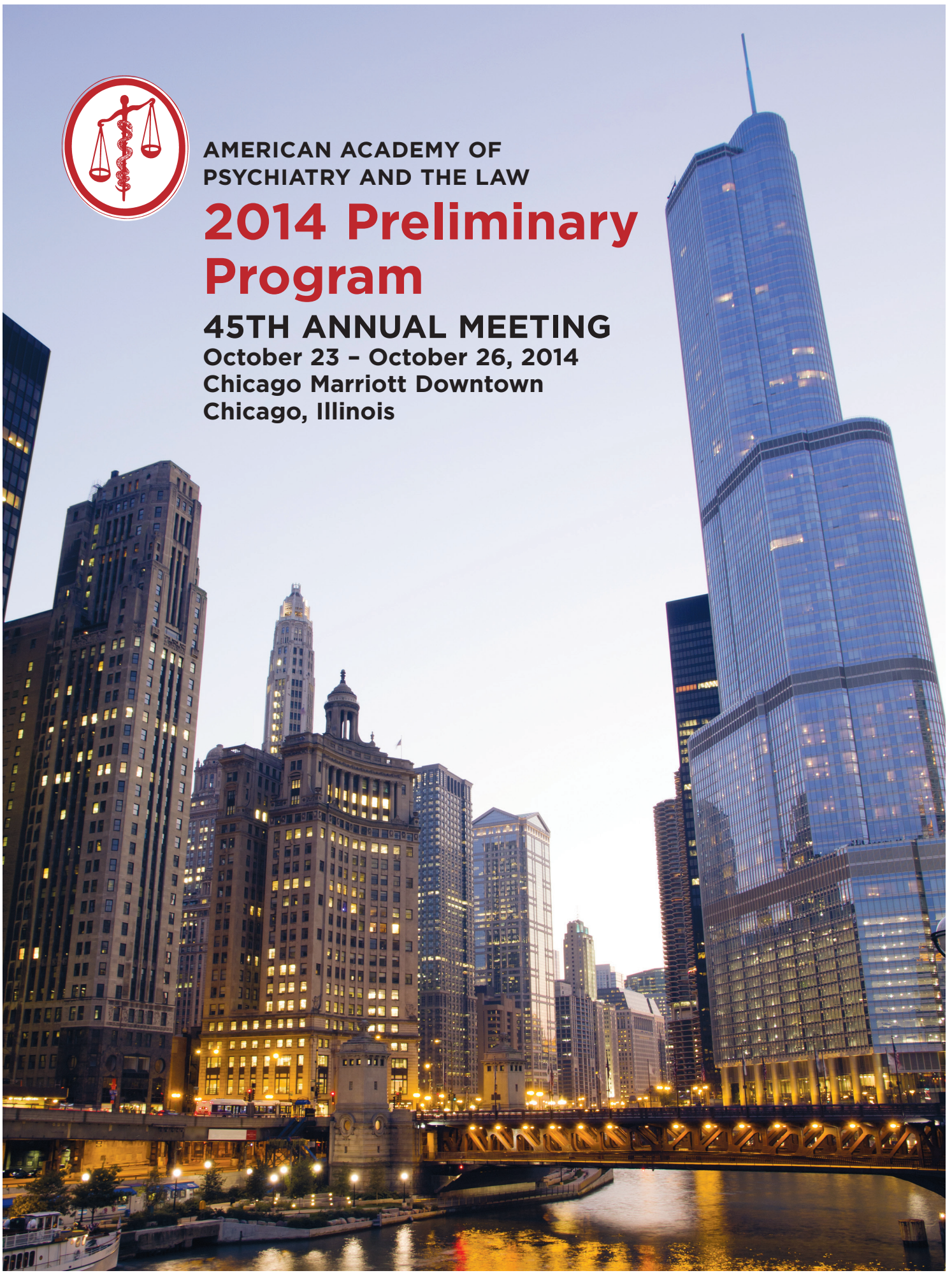

Should the Science of Adolescent Brain Development Inform Legal Policy?

Laurence Steinberg, PhD

Laurence Steinberg, PhD, is the Distinguished University Professor and Laura H. Carnell Professor of Psychology at Temple University. He received his A.B. in Psychology from Vassar College and his Ph.D. in Developmental Psychology from Cornell University. Dr. Steinberg is a former President of the Division of Developmental Psychology of the American Psychological Association and of the Society for Research on Adolescence, former Director of the MacArthur Foundation Research Network on Adolescent Development and Juvenile Justice, and a member of the MacArthur Foundation's Research Network on Law and Neuroscience. An internationally recognized expert on psychological development during adolescence, Dr. Steinberg's research has focused on a range of topics in the study of contemporary adolescence, including adolescent brain development, risk-taking and decision-making, parent-adolescent relationships, school-year employment, high school reform, and juvenile justice. He was the lead scientist in the preparation of the American Psychological Association's amicus briefs submitted to the U.S. Supreme Court in *Roper v. Simmons*, which abolished the juvenile death penalty; *Graham v. Florida*, which banned the use of life without parole for juveniles convicted of non-homicide crimes; and *Miller v. Alabama*, which prohibited the use of mandatory life without parole for all juvenile crimes. He has been the recipient of numerous awards, including the American Psychological Association's Bronfenbrenner Award for Lifetime Contribution to Developmental Psychology in the Service of Science and Society and its Award for Distinguished Contributions to Research in Public Policy, as well as the National Academy of Sciences Henry and Bryna David Lectureship. He is the author of approximately 350 articles and essays on growth and development during the teenage years, and the author, co-author, or editor of 17 books, including *Age of Opportunity: Lessons from the New Science of Adolescence*.

Power and Greed and the Corruptible Seed: Mental Disability, Prosecutorial Misconduct, and the Death Penalty

Michael Perlin, JD

Michael L. Perlin is Professor of Law at New York Law School (NYLS), Director of NYLS's Online Mental Disability Law Program, and Director of NYLS's International Mental Disability Law Reform Project in its Justice Action Center. He has written 23 books and over 250 articles on all aspects of mental disability law; his most recent books are *International Human Rights and Mental Disability Law: When the Silenced are Heard*, *Mental Disability and the Death Penalty: The Shame of the States*, and *A Prescription for Dignity: Rethinking Criminal Justice and Mental Disability Law*. Formerly the Deputy Public Defender in charge of the Trenton (Mercer County) regional office of the NJ Office of the Public Defender and the Director of the NJ State Division of Mental Health Advocacy, he "second sat" the death penalty case of *Strickland v. Washington* (on the question of effectiveness of counsel) before the US Supreme Court, and has served as an expert witness in death penalty cases involving defendants with severe mental disabilities. His death penalty-related law review articles have covered such topics as jury behavior, adequacy of counsel, the application of the 8th amendment to death penalty defendants with mental disabilities, and competency to be executed.

The CSI Myth and Reality: Jurors', Judges' and Litigators' Expectations for Scientific Evidence

Gregg Barak, PhD

Gregg Barak is Professor of Criminology and Criminal Justice at Eastern Michigan University and the former Visiting Distinguished Professor in the College of Justice & Safety at Eastern Kentucky University. In 2003, he became the 27th Fellow of the Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences and in 2007, received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Critical Division of the American Society of Criminology. Barak is a two-time award winning author and editor of 15 books on crime, justice, media, violence, criminal law, homelessness, human rights, and related topics. His latest book, *Theft of a Nation: Wall Street Looting and Federal Regulatory Colluding*, received the 2012 Outstanding Publication Award given by the White Collar Crime Research Consortium of the National White Collar Crime Center, Washington, D.C.

The Honorable Donald Shelton, JD, PhD

Judge Donald E. Shelton has been a Circuit Judge since 1990. He served as Chief Judge of the Trial Court from 2010 - 2013. Judge Shelton is also the presiding judge of the Civil/Criminal and Juvenile divisions of the Trial Court. He has a distinguished record of public service including serving as a member of the Eastern Michigan University Board of Regents from 1987-1990, serving as mayor of the City of Saline from 1978-1986, and chairing the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) from 1983-1985. A long-time resident of the Saline area, he also has been a member of the city's planning commission, urban design commission, economic development corporation, and tax increment finance authority. Saline's "Shelton Industrial Park" was named for him in recognition of his community efforts. Born in Jackson, he earned his undergraduate degree from Western Michigan University, his Juris Doctor degree from the University of Michigan Law School, his Masters degree in Criminology from Eastern Michigan University, and his PhD in Judicial Studies from the University of Nevada. He served as a captain in the United States Army Judge Advocate General's Corps from 1969-1974, earning the Meritorious Service Medal in 1974. He is the author of several legal texts and has had numerous articles published in professional publications. In 2007, he received the Frank J. Kelley Distinguished Public Servant Award presented by the State Bar of Michigan. In 1994, he was nominated as a candidate for the Michigan Supreme Court. In 1992, he received the "Justice Blair Moody Judge of the Year" Award. Prior to joining the circuit bench, he was a partner in an Ann Arbor law firm and received the "Attorney of the Year" Award from the Washtenaw Trial Lawyers Association. Judge Shelton has been an adjunct criminology and political science professor at Eastern Michigan University since 1997 and has written for and lectured at numerous academic and professional organizations throughout the United States.

The Expert Witness in Psychiatric Malpractice Cases

Phillip Resnick, MD

This workshop will focus on practical aspects of serving as a psychiatric expert witness in malpractice litigation. The workshop will cover the initial contact with the attorney, data collection, case analysis, report writing and preparation for discovery depositions. Instruction will be given in identifying the correct standard of care, use of the defendant psychiatrist's perspective, and avoidance of the hindsight bias and confirmation bias. Dr. Resnick will draw case examples from his experience of evaluating more than 180 malpractice cases. Principles of writing malpractice reports will be explicated. The differences in plaintiff and defense expert reports will be explored. For example, defense reports are only expected to address deviations from the standard of care identified by plaintiff's experts. In preparing for expert witness depositions, participants will be advised about what to remove from their file, the importance of not volunteering anything, and that nothing is "off the record." Handouts will include detailed suggestions for discovery depositions. Each participant will write an opinion about an actual suicide malpractice case. Participants will have an opportunity to defend their opinions in mock cross-examination.

Correctional Psychiatry for the Forensic Psychiatrist

Anthony Tamburello, MD; Jeffrey Metzner, MD;
Erik Roskes, MD; Robert Trestman, PhD, MD

Forensic psychiatrists are in demand in correctional settings for important roles including consultation with administration, mental health leadership, and clinical care for the most seriously mentally ill inmates. This course will equip participants to better appreciate how to interface effectively with key individuals in these systems, including custody and administrative staff. Medication problems specific to prison and jail will be discussed, including the prescription of controlled substances, minimizing the risk of medication abuse, and the management of a medication formulary. Suicide, deliberate self-harm, hunger strikes and violence in correctional settings are high-profile events that require expertise in assessment and management to improve outcomes and reduce liability. Connecting inmate patients with comprehensive community resources is critically important to reduce the risk of recidivism and to maintain the gains that may be achieved for these challenging patients.

Evaluation of Malingered Psychosis: Testing and Testifying

Charles Scott, MD; Barbara McDermott, PhD

The assessment of malingering is a critical component of a comprehensive forensic assessment. In order to accurately diagnose malingering, an evaluation is required to verify that feigning is occurring and an external incentive exists. This evaluation should consist of extensive interviewing, contact with collateral informants, and adjunctive psychological testing. Experienced clinicians often rely too heavily on clinical opinion alone without systematically assessing for malingering. In criminal forensic assessments, estimates of malingering are approximately 15 to 20 percent. Since successful malingerers are not included in these figures, the actual numbers may be higher. This course will describe the structured assessment strategies that are useful in evaluating the possibility of malingering of psychiatric symptoms. Two assessments will be described in detail: the Miller Forensic Assessment of Symptoms Test (M-FAST) and the Structured Interview of Reported Symptoms (SIRS). Relevant scale development information will be presented for each assessment, including validity, reliability and details of the normative samples. The administration of each instrument will be demonstrated with opportunities for attendees to receive supervised administration experience. Role playing of common types of evaluatees will be demonstrated, as well as pitfalls in courtroom testimony when these instruments are used.
