Format

For cancellations received in writing up to one week before the course begins, a \$60 processing fee will be charged. Thereafter, there will be no refund.

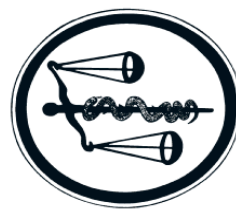
